Institutional Overview: Joliet Junior College	
Encollment approximately 10, 250	
<ul> <li>Enrollment – approximately 10, 250</li> </ul>	
62% part-time	
Roughly 50% white, 30% Latinx, 10% Black, less than 5% Asian	
Adult Education: Joliet Junior College	
<ul> <li>Robust program including ABE/ASE, ESL, Literacy, HS Recovery (early leavers program), and Transition</li> </ul>	
Large overlap with workforce led to strong relationship	
Full-time transition specialist

Serves as Pre-Apprenticeship CompTIA A+, Model 2 ICAPS Funded through CAP-IT

Institutional/Adult Ed Overview: Literacy Chicago	
<ul> <li>Community Based Organization</li> <li>Urban setting</li> <li>505 students</li> <li>ABE (35%), GED (23%), ESL (42%)</li> <li>45% unemployed, 20% employed, 35% retired</li> </ul>	
Literacy Chicago – Carpentry	
<ul> <li>Focus on basic skills</li> <li>Contextualized math and reading</li> <li>Stackable certificates</li> <li>OSHA license</li> <li>Roughly 20-30 students</li> <li>Pre and post testing</li> <li>Punch in M-F, 8-4:30</li> <li>10-12 weeks</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>92% placement</li> </ul>	
Literacy Chicago – Culinary Pre-Apprenticeship/Apprenticeship	
<ul> <li>Mostly women of color</li> <li>8-9 weeks</li> <li>9-3 every day</li> <li>35-40 students each year</li> <li>Partnership with hospitality union <ul> <li>After pre-apprenticeships, students are placed with union jobs in restaurants where they complete 1,000 hours of training</li> <li><u>UHCHI</u>-Unite Here Chicago Hospitality Institute</li> <li>4-5 star restaurants</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
