



Institutional Overview: Joliet Junior College

Enrollment: approximately 10,250

62% part-time

Roughly 50% white, 30% Latinx, 10% Black, <5% Asian



Adult Education: Joliet Junior College

Robust program including ABE/ASE, ESL, Literacy, HS Recovery (early leavers program), and Transition

Large overlap with workforce led to strong relationship

Full-time transition specialist

- 6 of 10 completed ICAPS

Institutional/Adult Ed Overview: Literacy Chicago

Community Based Organization

Urban setting

Enrollment: 505 students

ABE (35%), HSE (23%), ESL (42%)

45% unemployed, 20% employed, 35% retired

Literacy Chicago-Carpentry

- Focus on basic skills
- Contextualized math and reading
- Stackable certificates
- OSHA license
- Roughly 20-30 students
- Pre and post testing
- Punch in M-F, 8-4:30
- 10-12 weeks
- 92% placement



Literacy Chicago Culinary Pre-Apprenticeship/Apprenticeship

- Mostly women of color
- 8-9 weeks
- 9-3 every day
- 35-40 students each year
- Partnership with hospitality union
- After pre-apprenticeships, students are placed with union jobs in restaurants where they complete 1,000 hours of training
- <u>UHCHI</u>-Unite Here Chicago Hospitality Institute
- 4-5 star restaurants



Literacy Chicago Successes and Challenges

Successes:

- Roughly 100% retention
- Carpentry has served as a great recruiting tool
- Culinary student just promoted to head cook


