# **AIC** - Charges

**Charge I**: Expand apprenticeships geographically and to new industries, normalizing work-based learning and apprenticeship models with employers as a value-added workforce solution.

**Charge 2:** Increase diversity, equity, inclusion, and access to quality apprenticeship programs leading to careers and economic stability.

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# **AIC - Charges**

Charge 3: Formalize the apprenticeship ecosystem and statewide coordination across partnering state agencies and other workforce, education, and economic development professionals.

**Charge 4:** Grow statewide capacity to provide apprenticeship opportunities to job seekers and employers.

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#### **AIC - Priorities**

- I. Identify the factors that affect enrollment, retention, and completion of diverse apprentices.
- 2. Create a statewide 5-year apprenticeship expansion plan with input and agreement from WIOA core partners, industry associations and employers, community-based organizations and non-profits, secondary education, post-secondary education, local workforce areas, and other education, workforce, and economic development partners.

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#### **AIC - Priorities**

3. Support coordination of efforts and collaboration among all education, workforce, and economic development partners who offer or support work-based learning and apprenticeship programs for greater impact, establishing a comprehensive statewide infrastructure and ecosystem.

#### **AIC - Priorities**

4. Make it easier for employers and employer collaboratives to understand the workforce solutions and supports available to them and support in the creation of apprenticeship programs.
