



New Arrivals Project





 Biden Administration grants Venezuelan (New Arrivals) Temporary Protection Status (TPS) for those that arrived prior to July 31, 2023. Also granting New Arrivals to apply for Employment Authorization Documentation (EAD)



 Initially New Arrivals were housed in 22 local shelters. Currently, shelters have closed and many New Arrivals have moved out and found housing in the community.



 Since November 2023 Chicago Cook Workforce Partnership (The Partnership), scaleLIT, and Illinois Department of Employment and Security TPS and EAD Workshops capturing New Arrivals interest forms for Workforce and Adult Education & ESL services (Title I & II services).

- Collaboration between The Resurrection Project and Illinois Department of Human Services to bus New Arrivals from shelters to workshops
- Legal Aid Society of Metropolitan Family Services provided onsite legal aid and pro bono attorneys, and United States Citizenship and Immigration Services offered onsite intake and biometric services for applicants
- Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic supported connections to the local workforce services
- 3,467 workforce interest survey forms collected at TPS/EAD Workshop
- Hiring Events and Resource Fairs

Leverage Funding



- 1,720 New Arrival customers have been engaged and tracked by The Partnership and our One Stop Operator, scaleLIT
- Career Pathway Navigators funded by Cook County's ARPA Program assisted with referrals to ESL
- National Dislocated Worker Funds were leveraged by The Partnership to provide outreach to New Arrivals and connect them to workforce services and is composed of 12 New Arrivals recently hired on temp status (Community Outreach Teams) who obtained work permits
- Supplement Grant Funding used for sector-based training of 60 New Arrivals

FREEDMAN SEATING COMPANY

- All JARC Manufacturing training with New Arrivals takes place within Freedman Seating Company (FSC).
- Freedman Seating has been actively involved in helping shape the curriculum for the JARC Manufacturing Program. One of the projects for trainees is assembling a Fold Away seat much like the seats that are assembled on their shop floor.
- FSC has also expressed interest in hiring our program graduates
- New Arrivals hired are placed into entry-level position in manufacturing, including assembly.

New Arrival Persona: Maribel Sanchez



May 2022 - Maribel, a former lawyer and public defender, fled from Colombia and found asylum in Chicago. In 2023, Maribel and her family sought out TPS/EAD and other supportive services.

January 2024 - Maribel received her US work permit and began looking for work yet was having trouble securing a job interview.

February 2024 - Maribel met with a scaleLIT Navigator at the New Arrivals Resource Fair on February 14th. The Navigator introduced her and referred her to Central States SER for work readiness services. Maribel was interviewed by SER in March for a Quest funded staff position.

April 2024 - Maribel was hired by SER to be part of the QUEST Team. She reconnected with the Navigator team and was on boarded as Community Outreach staff.

May 2024 - Maribel has been engaging with New Arrivals at Metcalfe, Central States SER, community wide events and providing resource follow ups with TPS/EAD recipients. Maribel is exploring a legal career pathway with the Immigrant Justice Leadership Academy provided by The Resurrection Project.
