# HEARTLAND ALLIANCE ENDING POVERTY

#### Our ICAPS/IET targets:

- Advanced ESL learners age 18 or older and lives in Illinois
- Prerequisite: a high school diploma or (foreign) equivalent
- Scores 472 + on TABE 11/12 -R
- Has access to a computer and internet (we lend devices!)
- Is able to attend all classes

## ICAPS/IET Daily routine

# HEARTLAND ALLIANCE ENDING POVERTY

- Class meets online for 2 hours each day
- Students from all 3 specializations work together
- Live class: ESL instruction & workforce preparedness as a whole class or smaller "breakout" groups
- Daily homework

### Workforce Preparation



- Complete online interests assessments
- Research jobs related to your interests
- Identify barriers and create a plan of action to address difficulties
- Identify a personal goal and create a SMART Goal
- Create/improve your resume
- Write an "elevator pitch"

### Workforce Training

# HEARTLAND ALLIANCE ENDING POVERTY

- Students meet online with instructors
- Private sector instructor partners
- Students do workforce training only with other students in same specialization

### Contextualized Instruction (ESL)

- Advanced ESL
- Focus on reading & writing
- Students from all 3 specializations work together in small groups or as whole class with Heartland ESL instructor



### Schedule

Classes are 4 days per week, for 22 weeks.

- Monday Thursday
- Morning classes are from 9 to 11 a.m.
- Evening classes are from 6 to 8 p.m.

Classes are the same. Students choose the schedule that works best for them.



### Model 2 : Challenges

- Limited resources
- □ Challenging course material for students, even with screening mechanisms in place



### Model 2: What are our strengths?

- Flexible scheduling : AM & PM options
- Strengths-based philosophy of care = students bring a lot to the table!
- Culture of volunteer support



#### Problem statement

- ☐ Limited resources **and** students need:
  - Accountability coach & growth mindset reminders
  - Extra motivation in 1-on-1 setting
  - Networking help



### Volunteer Mentoring: Structure

- Identify professionals whose values are aligned with these needs
- Provide a job description & recruit
- Introduce mentors in context (e.g. Job Panel)
- Suggest matches & provide scheduling autonomy
- Current ratio: 1:2 Mentor: Student / Goal is 1:1
