

The Many Uncertainties in Higher Education


- Funding for higher education. The budget deficit is real and will be a challenge for many colleges/universities.

Unapologetic Thoughts on Workforce Development

- Creating the High School to College to Career Pipeline
- Ensuring Workforce Development Initiatives are linked to the College's Strategic and/or Educational Master Plan.
- Establish and maintain partnerships between educational institutions, industry stakeholders, and community organizations to create effective educational pipelines for students.

Unapologetic Thoughts on Workforce Development

- Colleges should highlight initiatives aimed at expanding short-term credential programs.
- Aligning and, in some cases, increasing educational offerings to meet labor market needs.
- Providing paid internships and apprenticeships across disciplines for community college students.
- Workforce Development Initiatives should not be focused on just Career and Technical Education but should be collegewide.

Dr. Gina Garcia talks about Dr. Robin D. G. Kelley's notion of the "**Freedom Dream**," an invitation to imagine an educational space that is grounded in racial equity, social justice, and collective liberation.

Unapologetic Freedom Dreams

What would be included in your Freedom Dreams for Workforce Development?

My <u>Unapologetic Freedom Dreams</u> include some of the following:


- Community college would be free, and student aid would cover the total cost of attendance.
- At community college campuses, blue books, scantrons, and pencils would be free to all students.
- Students would not have to pay for printing, public transportation, or parking.
- Through the FAFSA, community college students would automatically qualify for the <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance</u> <u>Program (SNAP)</u>.

- We would double what we offer for Pell Grants. What we currently offer students is simply not enough for our students or their basic needs.
- We would establish and maintain better and more robust crosssectoral partnerships with K-12, public housing, criminal justice, workforce development boards, and public health agencies to help lifelong learners access college however and whenever they need it.
- We would establish faculty academies to train former community college students who are enrolled in master's and doctorate programs and who want to become community college faculty.

Equity Avengers

- All high school students would have the opportunity to participate in dual enrollment that leads to pathways toward degrees, particularly Black and Hispanic/Latinx students.
- There would be a creation of a federal Black Serving Institution designation to support institutions of higher education.
- Accreditation and accountability would be viewed as a positive peer review process and not performative.
- The demographics of our faculty, staff, and administrators would better reflect the student population we serve.
